DISTRICT GOALS

1. Prepare for the District's Strategic Planning

 - Working with the Strategic Planning Firm to compile all forms of qualitative and quantitative data necessary for review during the process.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:**
 - Once the process begins, a significant portion of stakeholders, including parents, teachers, students, and community members, will be invited to participate in surveys, focus groups, or planning meetings.

2. Establish Updated School Zoning Map and Boundaries
