- Identifies a student's needs and required program(s) and service(s)
- In NJ in order to be eligible for an IEP, a student must require special education AND related services

IEP Team

- General education teacher
- Special education teacher
- Case manager
- Representative of the district
- Member of the Child Study Team
- Related services provider if applicable
- Parent
- Other individual(s) at the discretion of the parent or district who have knowledge or special expertise regarding the student
- The student beginning at age 14

Present Levels of Academic Achievement and Functional Performance (PLAAFP)

- Rationale for why the student requires special education and related services
- Discusses the student's current levels of functioning and performance
- Parent input
 - Opportunity to share information that would be important for teachers and staff to know
 - Can address concerns about the program in broad terms

Goals and Objectives

- Describes how the needs in the PLAAFP will be addressed through the program and services
- The primary areas/most critical skills identified by the provider that can be accomplished during the life of the IEP

- Goal the overall skill or concept
- Objectives the building blocks to attaining the goal

Recommended Program

- All students with special needs considered general education students overall
- The IEP indicates how/when students will be removed from general education
- Program descriptions in the IEP only indicate the special education programs and services
 - All other classes are assumed to be in general education

Extended School Year Program

Necessary when a student's skills are expected to regress significantly during the summer break and it will take an excessive amount of time to recoup those skills at the start of the new school year

- Focus is on maintaining a student's skills
- Not intended for enrichment or introducing new learning

Parent Consent

Two primary options to provide consent:

- Waive the 15 calendar day period to review the IEP and give permission for the IEP to start immediately
- 2. Take some or all of the time within the 15 days to review the content of the IEP
